



Thank you for your support over the years for SESOBEL, especially in recent times. SESOBEL just completed the most challenging year in its 43-year history. Without your support, we could not have survived the challenges. Allow me to give you an update on recent events and the path ahead.

The hardest day for me was June 30, 2019 – the final day of the last year - when we said goodbye to the children and youths with disability.

I had to inform the children that day that, for the first time ever, SESOBEL would not be open during the Summer, and we did not know whether we would be able to re-open in the Fall. After years of governmental irresponsibility and broken promises, SESOBEL had reached the end of the line in its funding.

What could I tell the children?

- That our national government, which is elected to serve the people, had not paid their promised support for over a year?
- That the State Ministries of Social Affairs-MoSA and Defense didn't sign contracts with SESOBEL, but expected SESOBEL to somehow keep serving the children of MoSA, military veterans and others?
- That our committed staff at SESOBEL had worked without receiving their full pay for the past year, out of love for them, but could not survive on no pay in the future.

We had to do something!

We could not let SESOBEL fail the children. So we began an unprecedented campaign, knocking on all doors to ask for support.

With other associations that work in the field of disability, we met with the President, the heads of various parliamentary blocs, ministers and deputies. We visited the Ministry of Social Affairs every week to beg them to pay what they had promised SESOBEL, and to sign the contract for the services they asked us to provide.

idividual staff members reached out to everyone around them to support SESOBEL.

The parents of the children were asked to help as much as they could within their means, and to make their voices, their fears, their sorrow heard.

Our friends from Australia, France, the United States and Lebanon stretched themselves to give whatever they could.

Media reported our story throughout the Summer and questioned ministers, deputies and even the President.

Our supporters and parents conducted press conferences, sit-ins, letter-writing campaigns and other actions.

Despite the challenges, and against all odds, our effort continues.

The following report gives you an overview of our activities over the past year. It tells a story of the dynamism of our team, the children, the friends, the members of the Council, the committees of ladies, the volunteers, young people, groups of parents and others.

captivating smiles of the children... the pride on their faces as they welcome our friends and serve meals at our events... the courage displayed by our youths at local and international sporting competitions... and seeing Elissa, Sarah and Lourdes waving SESOBEL pennant on the awards stand!

And so we persist, out of love for the children. We continue to accompany the children, hand in hand with their tender little hands that we hold and caress during rehabilitation sessions, physical therapy, and hydrotherapy. We continue to listen to the families of the children, at any time and in any place, with empathy – the sacred key for all of our staff. And when we see the thanks on the children's faces, or expressed through their words, we feel so gratified and feel the love of God emanating through them.

Every initiative taken by a child, parent, staff member, volunteer, donor, supporter and journalist combined like individual ripples of water to create a wave that allowed SESOBEL to reopen in September 2019. Behind every individual ripple was a grave and courageous individual who decided to take a STAND for SESOBEL. Thank you!

As I write this letter to you, I am overwhelmed with a sense of gratitude for God's grace shown to us through the beautiful children – God's children – whom we are given the opportunity to care for. I am grateful to so many for the support and help they provide to SESOBEL that made this possible.

The struggle is not over, but I have faith that SESOBEL will persevere under the gaze of Our Lady, Set El Beit, who has never ceased to watch over us, and who will certainly watch over our future and the children.

May our joy remain!

The foundations of our action are based on the human, existential, and spiritual dimensions conceived and established by Yvonne Chami, our


SESOBEL seeks to improve the situation of children with disability by meeting their basic needs, ensuring the unity of their families, and working closely with them.

Follow-up of 163 children: diagnosis, consultations, assessments, medical and rehabilitation care.


SOCIAL SERVICE

Family is the main partner in the child's journey. For a better family life and for the child's well-being, SESOBEL's social intervention takes a holistic approach and aims to develop parenting skills, strengthen family autonomy, and raise awareness within the community.

<u>Beneficiaries</u>: 73 families of children enrolled in SESOBEL's programs.

Group intervention:

Family guidance (164 participants): foster the development of parenting skills to maintain parents' abilities, overcome difficulties, and raise awareness of different disability issues.



- Action with the siblings (44 members): mobilize the siblings to defend their cause, act as an agent of change in the society, acknowledge their role, and live in harmony.
- Action with the parents' committee (11 members): provide support networks with parents and mobilize them to become a mutual support group and advocate for SESOBEL.

INNOVATIONS

- Implementation of the Halliwick Method (Technique to teach swimming for children with disability)
- Implementation of the Assistive Technology devices in rehabilitation sessions and classes to enhance the quality of life of children and youth in terms of communication and learning.
- Implementation of the PECS method (Technique for communication rehabilitation) to help children communicate their needs via pictograms.
- Teaching "Wheelchair service training package"- basic and intermediate level according to international standards established by the WHO (World Health Organization) in order to enhance the seating knowledge and quality in Lebanon and follow the international procedures.
- Proposing to polyhyandicap and severe intellectual disability children alternative behavior to express adequately their emotions: recognition and management of specific emotions in order to modify the behavior.
- Introduction to disability and Grief management to small groups of children in class sessions

NEW TECHNOLOGY: EYE TRACKER

Joe, a 7 years old child, has a severe motor disability with a good cognitive level. He has difficulties speaking. He says few words, says yes and no, not enough for him to express all his needs. He is frustrated for not being able to communicate easily and not being able to control the movement of his hands. Therefore, an eye tracker with special adaptation enabled him to interact with the outside world and express his wishes.

Currently, Joe is able to formulate sentences by designating pictograms on computer. He can answer questions using his eyes and can follow the educational program adapted to his age and capacities.

Joe is now happier and more confident.



CONTINUOUS TRAINING CENTER / RESEARCH & DEVELOPEMENT

Our mission is to promote the quality of care for people with disability, allowing them a better integration into their family and social environment.

Action taken:

Intra-Muros: From July 2018 till June 2019, the training center organized 25 training modules divided into 162 sessions for 269 participants. The training modules were led by 13 professionals from SESOBEL, 3 foreign experts, 4 Lebanese experts, and 5 AUB groups-42 people (American University of Beirut). The modules consisted of 23 technical trainings and 2 administrative trainings.

Extra-Muros: From July 2018 till June 2019, SESOBEL was asked by the association Himaya, ITFL and Caritas to teach their team about disability. The training module was facilitated by 12 professionals from SESOBEL, 166 people participated and 88 hours of teaching were assured.

16 Interventions in 13 seminars were given by 11 professionals of SESOBEL including 6 in Lebanon (USJ, UL, OPTL, HTF and Islamic univestity) and 7 abroad (United States, Brussels, Paris, Dubai and Alexandria).



► The art of «LIVING TOGETHER»

The International Training Association held its 8th congress, «*la Recherche et l'Intervention Sociale (Aifris)*» for three days on July 2nd at the St. Joseph University – Beirut. Our social department presented SESOBEL's specific *art of living together*.

► EUROPEAN ACADEMY OF CHILDHOOD DISABILITY - Seminar

SESOBEL participated at the Seminar of the European Academy of Childhood Disability (EACD 2019) held in Paris from May 23rd to May 25th, 2019. This seminar brought together more than 1200 specialists and researchers in the field of comprehensive care for children with disability. Two Posters presented by SESOBEL's team were accepted by the seminar committee along with an oral presentation:

Posters.

- The effect of an added weight on gait and cardiopulmonary adaptations in children with cerebral palsy (CP).
- How does standing postural alignment differ in spastic diplegia walking with different gait patterns?

Oral Presentation:

-Chewing training in children with cerebral palsy: combining motor and functional exercises.











EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

The core of our mission is to accompany each child in his difference and his particularity. Whatever the disability, we believe that every child is important and has value and a message of love to share.

To implement this mission, educational programs adopt a comprehensive, specialized, interdisciplinary and individualized approach, taking into account each child's pace, needs and abilities. This approach is primarily based on the sensory-motor stimulation program, the preschool and school program, the functional learning program, sports, music and artistic activities while enjoying events and outings.

Together, we build relationships with children in a climate of mutual respect, trust and love.

Children in the educational programs:

The educational programs welcome children and youth with disability aged 18 months to 20 years. Five units regroup them according to their age and needs.



SCHOOL INCLUSION PROGRAM

The School Inclusion Program welcomed **12 children** at the Jezzine Public School in southern Lebanon:

8 children in Partial Inclusion

4 children in Total Inclusion

The children follow an adapted curriculum based on the school curriculum of the State, accompanied by an academic reinforcement and a re-educative speech and psychomotor approach. The overall goal is to ensure a healthy development of the child in an inclusive context by working with families, schools and the environment.

Responding to the skills of each child, the activities were varied: personal autonomy, adapted didactics, socialization, expression activities, and human & spiritual animation



ACHIEVEMENT

From March 8th till 22nd 2019, UAE hosted the International Special Olympics Games during which 190 countries competed with 7500 athletes with disability. Yes, SESOBEL participated!!
