







While I was leaving my office at the end of the day, I met a lady who brought her two children with severe disability (Epilepsy, profound retardation, and serious osteoporosis...) for a medical checkup.

The Mother was happy to see me. She greeted me warmly and said, "Mrs. Safi, I am very grateful for everything that you are doing for my children." I responded, "My dear, we are only doing what we are committed to do. Pray for us; we need your prayers." She looked at me and said, "No, you don't need prayers, you should not worry because you are doing Good things; The Lord and his Mother will always be by your side."

Her faith and reassurance moved me. On my way home, I could only think of how dire our situation has become: the economic crisis, the coronavirus pandemic, Beirut port explosion and its repercussions, shortage of medical care, medicine, gasoline, water and electricity... Even the famine that threatens the citizens because of the hyperinflation didn't shake the government.

An article published in the newspaper "Le Temps" described our situation well: "... In Lebanon, the journey to hell has started... Switzerland of the Middle East sinks..."

But we refused to give up; we have faced anxiety, uncertainty, fear, and discouragement. We have overcome multiple difficulties by relying on each other only to do the "Good" for the people who count on us, our children and youth with disabilities and their families.

This "Good" is expressed by the joy of our children and youth who have received medical, social, food, and hygiene assistance. Additionally, we provided them with continuous guidance in terms of rehabilitation and special education whether online or in person when the country's situation allowed it and their parents were able to bring them in. This report clearly portrays our action this year.

However, "Good" could not be achieved without benefactors. All of this wouldn't have been possible without the willingness, compassion and continuous support of our friends, contributors, sponsors, godfathers and godmothers, donors, partners, advisors, bishops, and organizations who believed in us and gave us the means to survive.

This "Good" wouldn't have been possible without the commitment of our team, their efforts, dedication, and Love.

To all of you dear benefactors in Lebanon and abroad, we pay tribute because you enabled us to persevere... SESOBEL's mission will continue.

PARENT TESTIMONY

"Yes, there is irregularity in the brain and we need to recheck this after a year from today" said the pediatric neurologist to us after looking at the MRI and checking my 8 month old daughter. Julia was having trouble sitting up by herself, so her pediatrician referred us to a neurologist.

One year later we went back with a new MRI, after a long observation and another checkup, the doctor explains that Julia has periventricular leukomalacia, which means that the white matter in the brain is less than normal and throughout the past year, after comparing the old and new MRIs, the condition isn't getting worse so it's not degenerative. That was it. I was waiting for more, some detailed explanation, some instructions. So I ask the doctor, "What can we do now? How can we help her?" The doctor wrote down the name and number of a psychomotor therapist and said Julia can benefit from therapy. "Your daughter is fine, Mrs. Chayeb" she added.

Of course now I know that is entirely not true. Due to PVL, Julia has general development delay and severe intellectual disability. What was the doctor thinking telling me that 'my daughter is fine' is still a mystery to me. I went on with life clueless of my daughter's needs and proper ways of care. I got caught up with therapists that were more like dealers each giving me advice that suits their trade until I was advised, in a whisper, to go check SESOBEL. This was whispered to me because the person giving it thought I might take this as an insult. To some people telling someone to enroll their child in a school for special needs is a big taboo. Until today, I'm not sure if that person knows she has given me and Julia the greatest gift.

A new chapter in our life started, we entered into the family of SESOBEL. We were out of the tornado into a clear and stable path. From our first meeting, Julia was greeted with the gift of dignity and this was presented before the medical care, therapy and education. We felt Julia was as precious and unique to SESOBEL as she was to us and that made all the difference. There was not a 'person' who worked on Julia's case but a professional team that gave our family support and experienced advice that one cannot find in their direct family members who usually are a good source of information on raising kids. They listened to our small needs and gave us specifics.



I don't have any other children, so Julia is an only child at home and I recently discovered that she's bonding so well with her friends at SESOBEL... a bond that goes beyond friendship. On one of my visits, I was surprised to see the ease of expressing her emotion to her friend despite her difficulty to communicate. I saw her walk over and give him a really long hug with her eyes closed tightly which I know means a big emotion for Julia. To her, they are a true family.

SESOBEL is a HAPPY place. Normally, each time any of us overcomes a difficulty or if you make an accomplishment you're really happy about it. Well in SESOBEL that's the core business, overcoming difficulties all day long, so imagine the amount of joy that exists here. This is the happiness you feel the minute you enter the building, you feel it in the atmosphere, in the faces, the voices, in the energy.

Is it hard having a special needs child? Yes and No. Yes it's hard, if you do not understand your child's needs and have no support or access to the proper tools...life tools. No it's not hard, our children are just like all other children, raising them properly needs patience, understanding and lots of love.

A MESSAGE TO SPECIAL PARENTS:

We all have our ups and downs, that said, I have 3 pieces of advice. 1. Look for the proper support to help you stand by your child and care for him.

2. Accept your child. He is a human with a soul and he deserves life. Cherish and respect this.

3. Keep your head up, you are the parents of an angel on earth.
